More than one thousand religious leaders from 50 nations gathered from August 28 to September 1 in an unprecedented meeting at the United Nations. They had come together to harness the power of faith to bring about tolerance, peace and dialogue among warring nations. UN Secretary-General Kofi Annan appealed to the leaders to help the UN bring world peace. Organizer Bawa Jain said, "The General Assembly hall of the UN will become a sanctuary where the prayers and blessings of our esteemed religious leaders will permeate these walls and leave their imprint for years to come."

The hall was then steeped in prayers offered from nearly every faith on Earth: Hinduism, Judaism, Christianity, Shinto, Islam, Buddhism, Jainism, Zoroastrianism, Indigenous faiths, Sikhism, Taoism and Bahai.



The richness and diversity of our religious tradition throughout history is a spiritual resource long ignored by people of faith, who are often afraid to open their minds to teachings first offered outside their own system of belief. But the emergence of a civilization in which knowledge moves freely and almost instantaneously throughout the world has led to an intense new interest in the different perspectives on life in other cultures and has spurred a renewed investigation of the wisdom distilled by all faiths. This

panreligious perspective may prove especially important where our global civilization's responsibility for the earth is concerned.

Respect for life and for the dignity of the human person extends also to the rest of creation, which is called to join man in praising God."


Nevertheless, there is no doubt that many believers and non-believers alike share a deep uneasiness about the future, sensing that our civilization may be running out of time. The religious ethic of stewardship is indeed harder to accept if one believes the world is in danger of being destroyed — by either God or humankind. This point was made by the Catholic theologian Teilhard de Chardin when he said, "The fate of mankind, as well as of religion, depends upon the emergence of a new faith in the future." Armed with such a faith, we might find it possible to resanctity the earth, identify it as God's creation, and accept our responsibility to protect and defend it. 



Pope Benedict, in his first Christmas address, on Sunday urged humanity to unite against terrorism, poverty and environmental blight and called for a "new world order" to correct economic imbalances.

The Pope made his comments to tens of thousands of pilgrims gathered under umbrellas in a rainy St Peter square for his "Urbi et Orbi" (to the city and the world) message and blessing.

In his address, telecast live from the central balcony of St Peter's Basilica to tens of millions of people in nearly 40 countries, he also urged his listeners not to let technological achievements blind them to true human values

He said humanity should look to the Christ child for encouragement in times of difficulty and fear.

"A united humanity will be able to confront the many troubling problems of the present time: from the menace of terrorism to the humiliating poverty in which millions of human beings live, from the proliferation of weapons to the pandemics and the environmental destruction which threatens the future of our planet," he said.

"Do not fear; put your trust in him! The life-giving power of his light is an incentive for building a new world order based on just ethical and economic relationships," he said, speaking in Italian.

The need emerged for a new world order in economic and political spheres but also and especially in cultural and spiritual spheres, that is, a renewed humanism. A new social, political and economic order does not work if there is no spiritual renewal, if we do not find God.


Fatima to Become Interfaith Shrine Portugal News, November 1, 2003

Definition of Faith Sector

When I go out and I start telling people, "Do you want to work with us on poverty, disease, AIDS, illiteracy, injustice?" I often find people are more unwilling to work with us than we are willing to work with them. In other words, we're saying, "You don't have to change your beliefs for s to work with you." If you can only work with people that you agree with, then most of the world, you're ruling out. Okay. I don't insist that a Moslem change his belief for me to work on poverty. I don't even insist that a gay person has to change their beliefs. They're not going to accept my belief, or I'm not going to accept theirs.

Contemplative Practices



Many Christian leaders started searching for a new approach under the banner of "spiritual formation." This new search has led many of them back to Catholic contemplative practices and medieval monastic disciplines.

Though the outlines of Thomas Merton's life are generally known to his many readers, the details of his spiritual development are less familiar. Taking up where Merton's own *Seven Storey Mountain* ends, this penetrating biography by Lawrence Cunningham explores Merton's monastic life and his subsequent growth into a modern-day spiritual master.

Cunningham shows that Merton's prolific writings and his continuing influence can only be understood against the background of his contemplative experience as a Trappist monk. "If one does not understand Merton as a monk," writes Cunningham, "one does not understand Merton at all."



Following the trajectory of Merton's life, starting from his entrance into the Abbey of Gethsemani, Kentucky, in 1941, Cunningham highlights the development of Merton's monastic life against the cultural background of the American experience and the vast upheavals in the Roman Catholic Church. This unique approach clearly reveals the paradox of Merton's life. Here was a person deeply involved in the cultural struggles of his day despite having made a conscious decision to draw away from the world in silence and solitude. With both pen and voice, Merton continued to face the most

seething issues of the century, including the antiwar and civil-rights movements. Equally intriguing was Merton's dialogue with Zen Buddhism, a figurative and literal journey to the East that ended with his death in Bangkok in 1968.

Adding to the interest of this balanced and reliable biography is a foreword by Father Timothy Kelly, the current abbot of the Abbey of Gethsemani, who was himself a novice under Merton.



In my case intimacy with Christ had developed gradually over the years, primarily through what Catholics call "centering prayer." Each morning, as soon as I wake up, I take time—sometimes as much as a half hour—to center myself on Jesus. I say his name over and over again to drive back the 101 things that begin to clutter my mind the minute I open my eyes. Jesus is my mantra, as some would say.

The constant repetition of his name clears my head of everything but the awareness of his presence. By driving back all other concerns I am able to create what the ancient Celtic Christians called "the thin place." The thin place is that spiritual condition wherein separation between self and God becomes so thin that God is able to break through and envelop the soul.

I learned about this way of having a bornagain experience from reading Catholic mystics, especially The Spiritual Exercises of Ignatius Loyola... Like most Catholic mystics he developed an intense desire to experience a "oneness" with God. Gradually, he came to feel an intense yearning for the kind of spiritual purity that he believed would enable him to experience the fullness of God's presence within. p. 30
